Stan Gibbons was an unkempt alcoholic who spent months on end in drunken stupors surviving solely on whisky, meths and even a certain brand of metal polish. He stood in Stafford Assizes charged with armed robbery, robbery with violence and malicious wounding.

In a mental hospital he was told by a psychiatrist. *"You are no good, never have been and never will be."* Yet today Stan Gibbons is a changed man with a Christian home and family. Read Stan's story in his own words:

"Life for me began in a prison cell on November '22nd, 1962, at about 3.30 p.m. While in the Visiting Room with my wife, I realised that there was something terribly wrong with her. My immediate reaction was to escape, to sort out her problems. As I thought about this I felt that I wanted a smoke. Having no cigarette papers I ripped a page out of the cell Bible to use as substitute. As I tore out the page, these words hit me, *"If you shall ask anything in my name I will do it."*(1)

Here, I suddenly realised, was the only way I could ever help my wife. In that lonely cell I got on my

knees. I asked Jesus Christ to help me. My cell at once felt overcrowded. My Saviour had come to me. I prayed just as God helped me. First my sins to go. I confessed all to God and prayed for His forgiveness. Immediately I KNEW I was forgiven. I wanted to open my eyes and look at my Saviour. He seemed so near; but I was so ashamed and deeply touched to know that Someone could care so much for me, that I couldn't move an eyelid. This was followed by prayer for God's help, then prayer for my wife. I learned the following day that my wife was in hospital, and only a miracle had saved her life. Within a week several incidents occurred which proved to me that just as I had completely given my life to Christ, He had given me a completely new life.

Before I finished my sentence I was able to tell some six hundred convicts and others how the Lord Jesus Christ had changed my life.

After my release it took my friends some time to accept that I was a changed man, but eventually they did and now they respect my convictions. My days of dishonesty are over, drinking has been no problem. My wife has given her life to Christ, and so also has our seven year old son.

Where are you heading for? Maybe your life has been worse than mine, or maybe much more honest and happy. But Jesus Christ said: *"Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God."* (2)
